



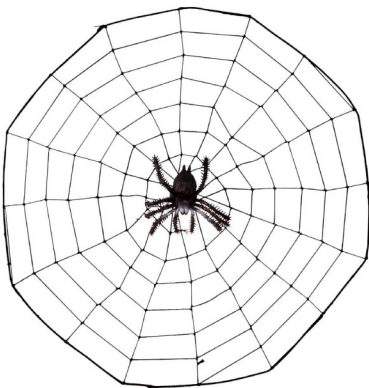

Baldface Hornet & Spiders

Baldface Hornet

Bald Faced Hornets are actually wasps. They are black with white or yellow stripes around their thorax and abdomen. They measure about one inch long, can fly very fast and are aggressive. Bald Faced Hornets create a newt which is gray and round. The nest ranges in size from softball to beach ball. These nests consist of cellulose and are quite strong. Likely nest locations include trees, shrubs and the overhangs of buildings.



Fun Facts About Spiders

- Spiders range in size from small though to balance comfortably on the tip of a pencil to almost 14 inches in diameter.
- The average person will encounter some 50 different kinds of spiders in their lifetime. Of those, only a dozen are capable of piercing the skin with their fangs.
- Spider silk is the strongest natural fiber known. It's excluded as a liquid and hardens when pulled by a spider, this aligning the molecular structure.
