## Lawns going to Seed

Every May, lawns undergo the natural process of producing seedheads. Each variety of grass can produce seedheads at different time, which can give your lawn a patchy appearance.

Seedhead production requires lots of energy, and can give your lawn a thin, stalky, stemmy appearance. Since seedhead stalks are white, you lawn may lose its some of its dark green color. There is nothing that can be done to prevent your lawn from going to seed and the process will last about 3 to 4 weeks.

The best way to deal with seedheads is to mow your grass on a regular basis with a sharp mowing blade at a height of 3 to 3.5 inches. Don't lower your mowing height to try to remove seedheads, this could cause damage to the turf and open it up to weeds and crabgrass.
